1) What is accreditation?

Accreditation is defined as official acknowledgment or conformity to official standards.

2) Why is accreditation important?

- Assists in determining whether an institution meets or exceeds minimum quality standards.
- Assists students in choosing appropriate colleges for enrolment
- Assists institutions in determining acceptability of transfer credits
- Helps employers determine the validity of programs of study and whether a graduate is qualified (*Employers often require evidence that applicants have received a degree from an accredited school or program*).
