1. B'nai Brith's Lawsuit Attacks Campus Free Speech, Student Democracy



On Wednesday B'nai Brith announced a lawsuit against McGill University, Student Society of McGill University (SSMU) and student group Solidarity for Palestinian Human Rights (SPHR).

The apartheid lobby group is angry that undergraduate students were asked to vote in March on whether they supported Palestinian rights. Their press release openly states their objective is to deter student democracy across the country. "These types of referendums are not restricted to McGill, this is a problem in universities across Canada, and we hope other universities are paying attention," said Sam Goldstein, B'nai Brith's Director of Legal Affairs.

B'nai Brith has been campaigning aggressively to defund student unions and associated organizations. In 2019, B'nai Brith created a coalition of anti-Palestinian groups that called on Ontario students to take up "a unique opportunity to deny funding to" student associations. They pressed the University of Toronto's administration to withhold its graduate students' union funding. B'nai Brith was also granted intervener status on the side of the Doug Ford Conservatives in a court case between the Canadian Federation of Students/York Federation of Students and Ontario regarding the government's move to force universities to grant opt-outs for various student fees.

The immediate background to the announced lawsuit is 71% of McGill undergraduate students voted for a resolution that commits SSMU to take a stand against Israel's system of racial discrimination. The resolution called for a host of measures including SSMU divesting from and boycotting "corporations and institutions complicit in settler-colonial apartheid against Palestinians."

In response, B'nai Brith released a statement labeling "SSMU's behavior...antisemitic". It "called on McGill University to immediately cease funding SSMU until it rescinds this bogus referendum result."

B'nai Brith's recent suit is probably partly a response to the success of the Waters event. It's odd to sue a university and student groups in the middle of summer for a vote that took place four months earlier.

By repeatedly conceding to B'nai Brith's bullying, McGill's administration has emboldened the apartheid lobby group to create a climate of intimidation regarding the discussion of Palestinian oppression.

B'nai Brith's lawsuit is clearly an attempt to create "a culture of ostracization and disrespect due to students' identity, religious or political beliefs." The McGill administration must defend its pro-Palestinian, anti-apartheid students from B'nai Brith.

# 2. 15-Year-Old Child Hit in the Head by Tear Gas Grenade Fired by Israeli Soldiers



A 15-year-old Palestinian child was hit in the head by a tear gas grenade fired by Israeli soldiers on Monday, in the town of Kufr al-Deek, near Salfit, the official Palestinian news agency WAFA reported.

According to local sources, Israeli soldiers fired tear gas and stun grenades at town residents during confrontations that broke out as the army was demolishing a house claiming it was built without a permit.

## August 2nd, 2022

1. Israeli Forces Kill Palestinian Teenager, Injure Another in Jenin Refugee Camp



Israeli forces killed a Palestinian teen and injured another Monday night, during a military raid in the Jenin refugee camp, the official Palestinian news agency WAFA reported.

The Health Ministry confirmed that 17-year-old Dirar al-Kafrayni was killed and another Palestinian was injured by Israeli military gunfire in the occupied West Bank refugee camp.

Wessam Bakr, the director of the Jenin Public Hospital, said that the bullets hit him in the shoulder, penetrated his chest and exploded inside, causing his immediate death.

The other casualty, who sustained a foot injury, was taken to the Ibn Sina Hospital, where medics described his condition as moderate.

The violent confrontations erupted when undercover Israeli forces – known as Musta'ribeen or Mista'arvim in Hebrew – sneaked their way into the camp from several directions followed by a military bulldozer, as a helicopter hovered over the area.

The undercover unit leading tracking dogs showed up at the house of Bassam Saadi, a 62-year-old former prisoner, muscled inside and re-arrested him along with his son-in-law Ashraf al-Jada.

Saadi's wife sustained injuries during the arrest and was taken to the hospital for treatment. Local media and video footage showed traces of blood on the floor of his home after Israeli soldiers withdrew.

2. The Prison Intifada: Supporting Palestinian Administrative Detainees



The Israeli settler-colonial regime has long employed the policy of administrative detention as part of its carceral tactics against Palestinians. This policy allows Israel to detain Palestinians at any given time and indefinitely, without charge or trial. Its widespread and arbitrary application allows the Israeli regime to criminalize Palestinian social and political mobilization, and to thwart Palestinian resistance against ongoing violence and dispossession — all by framing these Palestinians as a danger to Israel's "security" and "public order."

Israel's use of administrative detention dates back to the early days of its violent inception, and detainees have consistently demanded an end to its use, highlighting the harm it inflicts on them and their families. On January 1, 2022, the nearly 500 administrative detainees held in Israeli prisons at the time launched a collective boycott of military courts and called on lawyers not to attend court sessions nor to engage in judicial processes related to their detention. This boycott, which ended on June 27, 2022,1 is a continuation of decades of Palestinian struggle against Israel's carceral policies — including through hunger strikes, demonstrations against prison authorities, and certain forms of cultural production from captivity.

This policy brief contextualizes Israel's use of administrative detention against Palestinians, historically and legally, and explains how the policy relates to the broader functioning of Israeli military courts and their criminalization of Palestinian activism. It also examines the detainees' most recent boycott of military courts, situating this action within the wider repertoire of detainees' responses to Israel's systemic violation of their rights. While the months-long boycott did not result in the termination of the practice of administrative detention, it affirmed that unified action by detainees, activists, lawyers, Palestinian political leadership, and allied local and international civil society and human rights organizations is needed to actualize this goal.

## August 3rd, 2022

1. Israeli Soldiers Open Fire at Gaza Farmers, Force Them to Leave their Lands



Israeli soldiers stationed at the borders separating besieged Gaza from Israel opened fire at Palestinian farmers working in their lands and forced them to leave the area, the official Palestinian news agency WAFA reported.

WAFA correspondent said Israeli soldiers based east of Khan Yunis opened live gunfire and shot tear gas grenades at the farmers east of Abasan, forcing them to cut their work short and leave the area to avoid injury.

2. UN experts decry Israeli regime's harassment of pro-Palestinian activists



The United Nations' Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) says Israeli authorities have confiscated large swathes of land and demolished more than 50 Palestinian-owned structures across the occupied West Bank in a time span of two weeks.

The OCHA said in its biweekly 'Protection of Civilians' report covering the period between June 28 and July 18 that some 47 of the targeted structures were demolished in Area C, which constitutes 61 percent of the West Bank and has been designated as 'firing zones' for Israeli military training.

The UN Security Council has in several resolutions condemned the Israeli settlement projects in the occupied Palestinian lands.

## 2. JNF Board to Vote on \$18M 'Purchase' of Occupied Palestinian Lands (UPDATED)



UPDATE: According to Haaretz, the vote to allocate the funds to obtain Palestinianowned land has taken place, and the proposal has been approved.

The Board of the Jewish National Fund (JNF) in Israel is scheduled to vote on the approval of the \$18 million allocated for the purchase of Palestinian-owned land, based in the Jordan Valley in the occupied West Bank, the Israeli newspaper Haaretz reported.

This comes after the Israeli Defense Ministry and the JNF attempted to buy the portion of land last year, which was halted after receiving international criticism due to the Palestinian who owns it, demanding legal rights to the balance of the land.

# 3. 'A Callous Act of Injustice': Amnesty International Calls for Urgent Release of Ahmad Manasra



Amnesty International called on Wednesday for the urgent release of Palestinian prisoner Ahmad Manasra, the official Palestinian news agency WAFA reported.

"It is outrageous that the Israeli authorities have renewed Ahmad Manasra's spell in solitary confinement," Heba Morayef, Amnesty International's Regional Director for the Middle East and North Africa, said.

Morayef made her remarks responding to the Israeli Prison Service's (IPS) decision to renew the solitary confinement of Ahmad Manasra, a Palestinian prisoner who has developed serious mental health problems since his arrest as a child seven years ago.

"Continuing to detain Ahmad Manasra in such inhumane conditions is a callous act of injustice. Ahmad has been diagnosed with schizophrenia and is severely depressed," she added.

The statement went on to explain that Manasra was just 13 years old when he was arrested.

"The decision to detain him should always have been a measure of last resort and for the shortest possible time. Now, he is said to be a shadow of his former self and has threatened to take his own life," AI said, adding that "the Israeli authorities must immediately revoke their decision to renew his solitary confinement, and urgently release him from detention."

# 4. Israeli Court Sentences Jerusalem Governor to Open-Ended House Arrest (VIDEO)



The Israeli District Court in Jerusalem on Thursday sentenced Adnan Ghaith, Governor of occupied East Jerusalem to open-ended house arrest, the official Palestinian news agency WAFA reported.

Ghaith's attorney Rami Othman told WAFA that the court did not specify a time period. Therefore, the house arrest will continue until the next trial, which could sentence Ghaith to time in prison.

This is not the first time Ghaith faces such a sentence: in 2000, he was placed under house arrest for more than two years. He was detained 35 times since he assumed his duties as Jerusalem governor in August 2018.

#### 5. Israeli fire kills two more Palestinian children



Israeli occupation forces arrested a top commander of the Islamic Jihad resistance group in the Jenin refugee camp in the occupied West Bank on Monday.

Since Friday, Israeli fire has also killed two Palestinian teens and escalated collective punishment of Palestinians in the besieged Gaza Strip.

Israeli forces invaded Islamic Jihad commander Bassam al-Saadi's home, arresting him and firing at Palestinian citizens, injuring them.

Israeli forces shot and killed 16-year-old Dirar Riyad Luft Al-Haj Saleh with live ammunition during the raid on Monday.

## August 5th, 2022

 Several Palestinians Injured in Jewish Settler Attack in Masafer Yatta (VIDEO)



Several Palestinians sustained injuries on Friday, in a Jewish settler attack in Masafer Yatta, south of Hebron (Al-Khalil), the official Palestinian news agency WAFA reported.

Recently, Israel's top court gave the army the green light to forcibly expel some 1,300 Palestinians living in twelve villages in the Masafer Yatta area, marking one of the largest expulsions carried out by Israel in recent decades.

Located in Area C of the West Bank, under full Israeli administrative and military control, the area has been subjected to repeated Israeli violations by settlers and soldiers targeting their main source of living – livestock.

It has been designated as a closed Israeli military zone for training since the 1980s and is accordingly referred to as Firing Zone 918.

# 2. Israel Deploys 'Attack Drones' over Gaza after Arrest of Islamic Jihad Leader



Israel deployed attack drones and increased its surveillance over the besieged Gaza Strip, fearing retaliation after its arrest of a Palestinian leader earlier this week, Haaretz reported on Thursday.

In an escalation of its 15-year-long siege, Israel shut all crossings into Gaza on Tuesday after it arrested Bassam al-Saadi, a senior member of Palestinian Islamic Jihad (PIJ).

The shutdown has stopped the transport of goods and aid into Gaza and prevented workers from crossing into Israel.

Immediate de-escalation appears unlikely, with Israeli Prime Minister Yair Lapid saying Thursday that Israel "will not shy away from using force to restore normal life in the south of the country, and we will not stop the policy of arresting terrorist operatives in Israel".

The Palestinian Islamic Jihad movement announced that the Gaza Northern Command leader of Al-Quds Brigades, Tayseer al-Jabari has been assassinated by Israel in an airstrike on Friday.

Earlier, the Israeli occupation army announced the start of a military operation against the Islamic Jihad movement in the Gaza Strip. It named it 'True Dawn'.


This was followed by announcements throughout Israeli media that Israel is targeting positions belonging to the Islamic Jihad in Gaza.

Al-Jazeera, the official Palestinian news agency WAFA and other sources have said that up to eight Palestinians were killed so far in the Israeli attacks. Aside from al-Jabari, the attacks also killed a 5-year-old Palestinian girl.

The latest escalation followed Israel's recent arrest of a top leader of Islamic Jihad in the occupied West Bank, Bassam al-Saadi. In return, the Islamic Jihad announced that it will respond to al-Saadi's arrest and alleged torture by the Israeli army, leading to an Israeli decision to seal off all of its borders with Gaza.

#### 1. Israeli Airstrikes Kill 5 Children in Jabaliya Refugee Camp



Israeli forces killed five Palestinian children in the Jabaliya refugee camp, north of Gaza, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health in Gaza.

Medical sources in Gaza Strip identified the children as Hazem Salem, 9, Ahmed Al-Nayrab, 11, Moamen Al-Nayrab, 5, Khalil Abu Hamadeh, 19, and Khalil Shabeer, 10.

As the toll of death, injury and destruction rose in Gaza on Saturday, the second day of Israel's surprise attack on the territory, the Biden administration reiterated its full support for Tel Aviv.

John Kirby, a spokesperson for the White House's National Security Council said the administration urges "all sides to avoid further escalation."

The European Union not only failed to criticize Israel's latest attacks on civilians blockaded in an occupied territory, but affirmed that "Israel has the right to protect its civilian population."

Brussels made no mention of the right of Palestinians to defend themselves and resist Israel's onslaught.

The EU acknowledged that "the ongoing escalation has already led to a number of casualties, with a number of people killed," but did not specify who caused those deaths.

In France, the government of President Emmanuel Macron said it "deplores" Palestinian civilian casualties without criticizing Israel's attack on Gaza.

By contrast, the Macron government said it "condemns" the Palestinian resistance for firing rockets in response, while reiterating its "unconditional commitment to the security of Israel."

In a slight departure from the pack, Irish foreign minister Simon Coveney said he was "deeply concerned" about the "impact of Israeli strikes on civilians."

But the Dublin government explicitly condemned the Palestinian resistance for the "indiscriminate firing of rockets."

## 4. Truce Announced in Gaza as Death Toll Rises to 41, Including 15 Children



Three days after the Israeli aggression on the besieged Gaza Strip, a negotiated truce was announced between Israel and the Palestinian Islamic Jihad movement. The truce went into effect at 11:30 PM on Sunday, Palestine time (GMT+2).

The Islamic Jihad movement confirmed the news of the truce, announcing that it welcomes the Egyptian role in reaching the agreement.

The truce followed three days of intense Israeli bombardment of the Gaza Strip, resulting in the death of 41 Palestinians, including 15 children and 4 women. 311 Palestinians were reportedly wounded in the Israeli attack.

1. Young Palestinian Dies of Wounds Sustained in Israel's Airstrike on Gaza

# 2. US Ambassador in Israel Refers to Palestinian Resistance as 'The Bad Guys'



US Ambassador to Israel Tom Nides said Washington completely supports Israel's fight against "bad guys" in the Gaza Strip, days after Israel launched an unprovoked war against Palestinian groups in the besieged region.

Speaking to Israel's Channel 13 for an interview on Wednesday, Nides said the US government is "aware of the situation going on in Gaza" and believes the latest Israeli operations there last week were part of "an important mission."

"These are bad guys," the envoy continued, referring to Palestinian armed groups, adding that.

"We support Israel's right to defend itself, its right to basically take the actions it needs to keep this place safe, so we're fully supportive of Israel's actions."

Lying wounded on her bed inside the Indonesian Hospital in Gaza, Rahaf holds tightly on the metal bar before raising her left hand to make V for victory. The other hand was blown up by Israeli bombs. Her foot too is missing, and her body is filled with burns.

Rahaf is only 11 years old. Her house in the Jabaliya refugee camp was bombed by Israel. She told the Palestine Chronicle, "My hand and foot went ahead of me to Paradise when I was injured by the Zionist occupation."

4. Israeli occupation forces gun down teen, wound two others in Hebron



Israeli forces Tuesday afternoon gunned down a Palestinian teen and wounded two others in the southern West Bank city of Hebron, according to the Health Ministry.

The Ministry said that 17-year-old teen Mo'men Yassin Jaber succumbed to his critical injuries sustained from Israeli military live gunfire during confrontations in downtown Hebron.

Jaber was hit by an explosive round that pierced and stopped his heart. He was rushed to Al-Ahli Hospital's intensive care unit, where medics attempted to resuscitate him, but to no avail.

The Ministry pointed that the other casualty, who remained unidentified, sustained live gunfire injury in the femoral artery. He was immediately admitted to the operating room.

Witnesses said that Israeli snipers deployed on rooftops in the area also hit 15-year-old minor by a live round in the foot. The minor was ultimately detained.

Meanwhile, Israeli troops manning the checkpoint at the entrance of the Hebron city neighborhood of Tal Rumedia assaulted Fayzeh Abu Shamsiya for filming them while holding a minor. She was evacuated to a hospital for treatment.
