Report: Israeli Forces, Settlers Committed over 700
Attacks against Palestinians in January



The Israeli occupation forces and Jewish settlers carried out more than 700 attacks against Palestinians and their properties during the month of January, according to the Wall and Settlement Resistance Commission.

In its monthly report on the Israeli violations and colonial expansion, the Commission said that these

attacks ranged from a direct assault on people, vandalism of property, leveling of lands, uprooting trees, seizure and demolition of property, closures, barriers, and physical injuries.

Most of these attacks were in the Nablus Governorate, followed by Jenin Governorate, then Bethlehem Governorate.

 Health Ministry: Death toll rises to nine, 20 wounded in Jenin raid



The death toll of the Israeli army raid into the northern occupied West Bank city of Jenin rose to nine and the number of wounded to 20, according to the Health Ministry.

It said that Israeli nine Palestinians were killed by Israeli army gunfire and 20 others were wounded, including four seriously wounded, during the violent raid into the city and neighboring refugee

camp.

The fatalities included an elderly woman, identified as Magda Obaid, 60. Two of the slain youths were identified as Saeb Issam Mahmoud Izreiqi, 24, and Izzidin Yassin Salahat, 26.

The Ministry pointed that all the 16 casualties, including a child, sustained gunshot wounds in the chest, shoulders, abdomen and lower extremities.

144 attacks by Israeli settlers last night in Nablus



A total of 144 attacks were carried out last night by Israeli settlers against Palestinian civilians and their property in the occupied West Bank province of Nablus, today said Ghassan Daghlas, a Palestinian official in charge of the settlement file in the province.

Daghlas said that fanatic settler groups hurled stones and partially damaged at

least 120 vehicles on roads, while they set on fire six vehicles completely damaging them. At least 22 Palestinian-owned shops were attacked by settlers in the town of Huwwara.

Daghlas said the majority of attacks were focused on the towns of villages of Huwwara, Madama, Qusra, Jorish and Majdal Bani Fadel.

Jewish settlers vandalized a church in the occupied Old City of Jerusalem and smashed a statue of Jesus, the official Palestinian news agency WAFA reported.

The Jerusalem Governorate said in a press statement that three Jewish settlers stormed the Church of the Condemnation,

located at the Second Station of the Via Dolorosa, smashed a statue of Jesus and attempted to set the church on fire.

The guard employed by the church quickly restrained the vandal before he could inflict further damage to the site.

• Arab League condemns Israel's "open war" on Palestinian people



The Arab League condemned today "the open war and the organized Israeli crimes" against the Palestinian people, which led to the death of dozens since the beginning of this year.

Secretary-General of the Arab League, Ahmed Aboul-Gheit, warned of the silence about the deterioration in the situation in the

occupied Palestinian territories with the escalation by the Israeli occupation forces in the West Bank.

Aboul-Gheit made the remarks during a meeting in the Egyptian capital, Cairo, with the representative of the European Union for the peace process in the Middle East, Sven Koopmans.

During the meeting, they discussed the latest developments in the occupied Palestinian territories and ways to confront the impasse in the political horizon.

• Israel kills five in Jericho raid



Israeli occupation forces killed five Palestinians during a raid in Aqabat Jabr refugee camp outside of the West Bank city of Jericho on Monday.

The raid comes less than two weeks after Israeli forces killed nine Palestinians during a similar operation targeting armed resistance activists in Jenin refugee camp. A

tenth Palestinian died from his injuries days later.

The Jericho area of the West Bank's Jordan Valley has been under siege for more than a week following an attempted shooting attack at a restaurant near Jericho frequented by settlers in late January.

• Israeli occupation forces have killed nine Palestinian children this year: Palestine



Israeli occupation forces have shot and killed forty-two Palestinians, including nine children, since the beginning of the year, according to the Palestinian health ministry.

The ministry said in a report on Wednesday that the number of Palestinians who have been killed by Israeli forces since the beginning of 2023 has risen to 42, including an

elderly woman and nine children, eight of them during January alone, Palestine's official Wafa news agency reported.

It said the Israeli regime has committed more crimes against Palestinians in the occupied territories in 2023 than any other time in recent years, adding that the new year has so far been particularly hurtful to children.

• BDS welcomes decision by Barcelona mayor to suspend twinning agreement with Tel Aviv



The Palestinian Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS0 movement welcomed the decision by the Spanish city of Barcelona to suspend ties with the Israeli city of Tel Aviv to protest the Israeli violations against the Palestinian people.

Barcelona Mayor Ada Colau suspended institutional relations with Israel, including the twinning agreement with Tel Aviv, "until the Israeli authorities put an end to the

system of violations of Palestinian human rights and fully comply with the obligations imposed on them by international law and the various United Nations resolutions."

The Palestinian BDS National Committee (BNC), the largest Palestinian coalition, said in a tweet that it "salutes the Mayor of Barcelona, Ada Colau, and the grassroots groups who helped end institutional links with apartheid Israel."

• With frequent power cuts, winters in Gaza can be deadly



It is 11:00 p.m. on a cold and dry evening east of Gaza City. The inside of Hani Saleh's home smells of soot — the remains of an entire night's burning of wood and coal in the same room to keep warm. The house is still cold.

The resulting moisture leaves large splotches on the white paint

of the walls. When it dries out, the paint peels off. The family of eight crams into a single living room, barely visible to one another in the dim flickering lights. It's not their bedtime, but the 20-amp battery that supplies their home with power has all but died after working for 10 hours without interruption.

Suddenly, the power comes back on, and everyone in the family jumps up at once, each of them scrambling to go about the tasks they had laid before them in the short power window they've been given. Shahd, still in high school, rushes to her desk in the next room, trying to fight off her fatigue.

"It's too late to focus, especially when it's so cold. I should've been sleeping by now," Shahd says. This is a critical year for her, as her exam grades will determine what major she will be allowed to take in college.

• ICJ sets dates for submission of statements on Israel's practices in the occupied Palestinian territories




Following the request by the General Assembly of the United Nations for the International Court of Justice (ICJ) to render an advisory opinion the legal on consequences arising from the policies and practices of Israel in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East

Jerusalem, the ICJ has fixed 25 July 2023 as the time-limit within which written statements on the questions may be presented to the Court, and 25 October 2023 as the time-limit within which States and organizations having presented written statements may submit written comments on the written statements made by other states or organizations.

The Palestinian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates today confirmed in a press statement that it had received an official letter with the decision of The Hague-based ICJ issued by a special meeting of its judges, which set the dates for the submission of written statements on the questions, and expressed satisfaction with the progress of the procedures regarding the advisory opinion.

The Palestine Chronicle correspondent in Gaza reported that loud explosions were heard south of Gaza City.



1. The Mysteries of Udolpho by Ann Radcliffe


